So too is with the days of Chanukah: even though Chanukah is only eight days - nevertheless we take the lessons from these eight days with us to "light up" each and every day of the entire year.

Especially that in Chanukah there are a lot of special things: it's an eight day Yom Tov, we celebrate through lighting candles, in a way that we add a candle every night, we say Hallel

and Hoda'ah (and V'al Hanisim) - a special love and thanks for Hashem on the miracles he did for us in the time of Chanukah.

There is no question that in all these special things there are a lot of lessons and a special light for all aspects of Yidden,

Until not only you are lit up but even the people around you. Until it is light in the street - like we learn from Chanukah that we light the Menorah "by the doorpost from the outside" in order that also in the street we should see that this is a Jewish home which is lit up with the mitzvah of Ner Chanukah.



Tustin news

History

The city of Tustin, MI is a very small city located in northern Michigan, and has only 256 families as of the end 5781. the city of Tustin was established in the end of 5704 with around 956 families. Later on in that year there was a man by the name of Malkiel, he moved to Tustin and needed a source of income, so he started a newspaper called "Tustin News" and he had it delivered to every household in Tustin, and he would get money from advertisements.

Many years later in 5759 when the population started getting bigger there was more news to report, the Tustin Newspaper decided to start with video news, so Malkiel hired a guy named John and for many years until the Tustin flood [the Tustin flood is known as one of the worst floods in American history, the flood destroyed most of the city, it left hundreds without a home and almost most of the city moved out and there was only 957 families left, as the years went on more and more left].

When it came 5778 there were so little people left that Tustin news had nothing to report about, and Malkiel had to fire all his employees, he would sit in his office waiting for some news for him to report about, he sat in his office for 4 years day in and day out just drinking coffee and waiting for the phone to ring.

It happened one day while Malkiel was drinking his morning coffee when suddenly the phone rang for the first time in 4 years, he jumped out of his chair and picked up the phone, it was the Rabbi Moshe Shemtov (director of Camp) he told him that we just bought the Kettunen center and we would like to put it in the Tustin newspaper, so they decided that they're going to wait until the campers come, in order to write up the article and make the news report on video. Now, they needed someone to be the news reporter on the video so they called camp and asked if they have a energetic person to be the reporter, camp obviously said "Yes we do, his name is Avi Katz" so the next day they called Avi and asked him if he is willing to do it and he said yes.

The next day Avi went to the Tustin news station to record the video and the next week the video went out (that's the video that we sent to the parents—it was not a camp video that's why there was only one video and not more).

After that video went viral Avi was voted the best news reporter (and only news reporter in Tustin).



Farbrengen

Yud Daled Kislev Farbrengen with the head counselors

We are pleased to welcome to this special GYYR Farbrengen in honor of Yud Daled Kislev our 3 head counselors of Machane Gan Yisroel Detroit, Tustin, MI:

Rabbi Levi Katz of Miami, FL, **Rabbi Mendel Azimov** of South Brunswick, NJ, and, **Rabbi Levi Shemtov** of West Bloomfield, MI.

First of all thank you all for joining this special Farbrengen.

Mendel Azimov, let's begin with the basics: what happened on Yud Daled Kislev?

Mendel Azimov: Well, on Yud Daled Kislev, 5689, the Rebbe and Rebbetzin got married. As you can imagine, even then, this was a tremendous simcha for Chabad chasidim around the world, and all the more so for us chasidim - this is our Rebbe's Chasuna!

Levi Katz, what does this day mean for chasidim

in our generation?

Levi Katz: For us this is much more than a wedding. The wedding anniversaries of all the Rebbeim are significant, as the Rebbe explained many times in sichos. However, the day of Yud Daled Kislev is even more unique: it is the day that marks the beginning of our connection to the Rebbe, the Nossi of our generation. As the Rebbe said, "Dos iz der tog vos hot mir farbunden mit eich, un eich mit mir — this is the day that connected me to you, and you to me." In simple terms, this day holds the beginnings of Dor Hashvi'i.

Wow!

Levi Shemtov, can you tell us a little bit about the chasuna itself?

Levi Shemtov: Let me just begin by saying that this wedding was not like the weddings we are used to - remember, this was the wedding of our Rebbe.

The Kabbolas Ponim was held in Yeshivas Tomchei Temimim in Warsaw, Poland. The yeshiva hall was decorated beautifully. Only those who had an invitation, or bribed the policemen with a large amount of money, were allowed to enter.

The Zal was packed from side to side, with Rebbes, rabbis, talmidei chachomim, the who's-who of Warsaw, writers from all the newspapers, and more. At six o'clock, the Frierdiker Rebbe arrived at the yeshiva, and was greeted by joyous singing. Several minutes later, the Rebbe arrived.

After the chuppah, during the seudah, the Frierdiker Rebbe himself walked amongst the tables with a bottle, distributing l'chaim to each guest and bentching them. After the meal was served, the music began once again and the entire crowd continued dancing. The Frierdiker Rebbe took the Rebbe and danced with him, with each putting one hand on the other's shoulder. The Frierdiker Rebbe danced quickly.

At 3:30 in the morning, the dancing concluded and the Polisher Rebbes took their leave. The crowd formed a half-circle around the Frierdiker Rebbe singing niggunim for about half an hour.

The chasuna concluded after 6:00 a.m.

Wow Levi, thank you so much.

Mendel Azimov, where was Reb Levik and Reb-betzin Chanah during the wedding - we didn't hear them mentioned when Levi Shemtov told us about the wedding?

Mendel Azimov: Actually, they were not at the wedding. The Rebbe's parents lived in Yekaterinoslav, which was under communist rule. The wedding was actually delayed for them to be able to come, but it soon became clear that the communist officials wouldn't let them go to the wedding. Nevertheless, they celebrated the Rebbe's wedding from their hometown in Russia by making a wedding in their own home, with the whole community joining with them in the simcha. Although the Chosson and Kallah weren't there b'gashmiyus, their presence was felt, and the dancing went on until 7 o'clock in the morning!

Wow!

Thank you so much for giving up some of your precious time and sitting with us to help us better understand what Yud Daled Kislev is all about.

Levi Katz: Oh and don't forget to Farbreng on Yud Daled Kislev.

Levi Shemtov: Gut Yom Tov Gan Yisroel!!!

THE 10 MIVTZOIM

MIVTZA TZEDAKAH

Brief History

It was in early 5734 after the victory of the Yom Kippur War and its difficult aftermath, the Rebbe sent Chassidim as his Shluchim to visit the soldiers and bring them encouragement. He instructed them to take coins with them, as gifts for the soldiers, so that they would have the ability to give Tzedakah even while in the army, where it is often difficult to fulfill this mitzvah, the Rebbe wrote, they would

bring Hashem's Brachos upon themselves. Simultaneously, the mitzvah

was expanded to everyone, that everyone should give tzedakah daily.

What it is?

To give Tzedakah daily. One should have a Pushka in every central location of the home, including: the kitchen, dining room, bedrooms, car, and office. This is a practical re-

minder that one should give Tzedakah and make the area around it to become a Dirah B'tachtobim!

When?

Tzedakah should be given every day.

Who it is for?

It applies to adults as well as to children. Children should have a Pushka of their own, They should give tzedakah of their own money every day (obviously don't give tzedakah on Shabbos, but on Friday have in mind Shabbos), and when it gets full, the child should be the one to call the Pushka collector.



Spiritual Effects?

When a person cares for someone else, Hashem cares for him.

Tzedakah is the way to achieve success in any endeavor—whether it is Davening, Mivtzoim, an operation, an event on Shlichus, a new business, winning GYYR missions raffles, and so on. Hashem specifically promises Parnassah for someone that gives Tzedakah.

Did you know?

The Rebbe said that the Pushka should be put in a location where it is visible on Shabbos, so that one remembers the mitzvah of Tzedakah even when it cannot be fulfilled.

Our Counselors

The stories of our most amazing counselors

Moshe Weiss is known in his family as "Moshele the youngest" (because he is the youngest in his family) with 10 sibling on top of him, Moshe had a hard childhood, he felt like he had 12 Tatty's and Mommy's and he always was looking for ways to be like or better than his older brothers.



The GYYR team called Mrs. Weiss (Moshe's mother) for a story about Moshe she told us the following story:

"When Moshe was in forth grade he was running for vice president of his school, he hung up signs all over the school that said "roll your dice and vote for Weiss" and he was telling everyone that they should vote for him because he will bring back hash browns for lunch (Moshe's favorite food is hash browns) so obviously everyone voted for Moshe because everyone wanted to be Moshe's friend and the end Moshe got the most votes and he was the vice president of school and as Moshe promised he brought back hash browns for lunch."

Many of Moshe's older brothers are close disciples of some of the most prominent Rabbi's and Mashpiim in our

generation one of them is even a son in law of a great and world renowned Mashpia (which is actually the Mashpia of many of the staff in camp).

Moshe wanted to be no different so when it came time for Moshe to go to Yeshiva he started calling his older brothers to ask them for tips on how to become good friends with the Rabbi's he would meet. So off to Yeshiva he went with all the tips necessary to be a good Bochur in Yeshiva and how to become good friend's with the Rabbi's.

As soon as he got to Yeshiva he right away started to talk to many of the Rabbi's and Mashpiim there, he was a good boy always listened in class and attended Farbrengens and he set up Chavrusos with many of the Rabbi's he came across, Moshe is a disciple of many of the great names in Chabad starting with our very own Rabbi Gurary, Rabbi Leima Wilhalm, just to mention a few.



But being a friend of these Rabbi's comes with a price, it means that if they need something you have to go get it, Moshe was known in Yeshiva as the coffee man, all the Rabbi's in Yeshiva would ask him to bring them coffee and if there was no coffee he would have to run to the store to buy, one time Moshe hears Rabbi Wilhalm ask him "Moshe Efsheer Breing Mir a Pareve Kave (please bring me Pareve coffee)" so Moshe

asked what do you want inside, he answered "one spoon of coffee and one and a half spoons of sugar" so Moshe went to bring him the coffee but there was no coffee left and Moshe was very tired weak and didn't want to go to the store to buy more so instead he brought him hot coco hoping that he wouldn't be able to tell the difference, he brought him the hot coco and right away sat down to continue learning, he was about to start learning and he hears Rabbi Wilhelm "Moshe you ruined all the Hamshochos you brought be a cup of coke not coffee" if you know Rabbi Wilhelm he has a very loud voice so the whole Zal heard and Moshe got very embarrassed he thought that Rabbi Wilhelm didn't like him anymore and he wasn't part of the club so Moshe was very down for a few weeks

Till it came the next Farbrengen, it was the legendary Yud Tes Kislev Farbrengen Moshe thought Rabbi Wilhelm wouldn't talk to him but as soon as he walked in Rabbi Wilhelm called him over and offered a seat right near him and Rabbi Wilhelm Farbrenged with him for 14 hours, this made Moshe very happy and made him feel like he was part of the club again but the good part was Rabbi Wilhelm never asked him for a coffee again.


